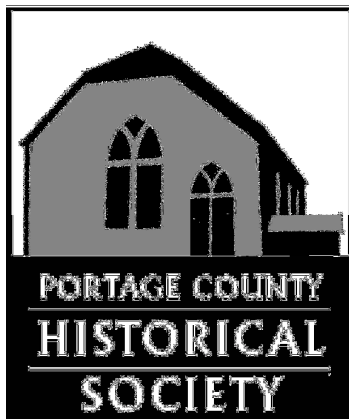


Portage County Historical Society

Built in 1885, this building was added on to c. 1896, four years after Stevens Point became a full time fire department. Used until 1967, when the new headquarters building was built on Franklin St. Historic Fire House N^o 2 became the first YMCA building. When the Y moved out c.1974 the building was used for storage until 2006 when the Portage County Historical Society purchased it from the City of Stevens Point.

This building currently houses the 1933 American LaFrance truck purchased by the City at the Chicago World's Fair, the c. 1890 hose wagon, and various other firefighting artifacts.

It also houses the first printing press in Wisconsin, which was brought to Stevens Point, via Oshkosh, from Green Bay, where it printed the first newspaper in Wisconsin.

There is also a display on fishing tackle produced by the Weber and Frost companies.

The art gallery is managed by Tony Bronk. A portion from the proceeds from the sale of the art work goes toward the maintenance and upkeep of this building.
